SERVICES OFFERED:

- **Tutorial Program**
 - How to get a tutor
 - Students must complete a Tutee Application (online)
 - Student will be notified via email on the status of their application for a tutor(s).
 - Specifications of Program
 - Tutors and Tutees will receive the contact information to establish a tutoring schedule that is convenient to both parties. (Tutoring schedule must be submitted to the Coordinator of Academic Support.)
 - All Tutoring must take place in the Black Cultural Center
 - If a Tutee misses two unexcused consecutive sessions of a total of three for the semester the session will be terminated.
 - It is the responsibility of Tutors and Tutees to establish clear communication regarding tutoring appointments, delays, or cancellations.
- **Early Alert Program**
 - Designed to help students make a successful academic transition into college life by monitoring their academic progress during the semester.
 - Students are given feedback on their daily performance, thereby, allowing them ample time to make whatever adjustments necessary for success.
 - Students who participate in the Tutorial Program have the option to participate in Early Alert.
- **48 Hours Study Session**
 - Scheduled each semester at the beginning of the study day(s) period.
 - The Black Cultural Center is opened for students, providing an atmosphere more conducive to studying, plenty of sugar and caffeine-as well as fresh fruit-to help students stay refreshed and alert while preparing for finals.
